### 1. Discussion Prompts

Use these questions to guide your group's discussion before each presenter arrives. Take a moment to reflect and prepare questions.

Session	Discussion Questions
Advocacy Resources for Directly-Impacted People	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- What are the biggest barriers directly impacted individuals face in accessing advocacy resources?</li><li>- How can organizations better support people navigating these challenges?</li><li>- What is one resource or strategy you found useful?</li></ul>
Political Education on Felony Disenfranchisement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- How does felony disenfranchisement impact democracy and communities?</li><li>- What are the most common misconceptions about voting rights for people with records?</li><li>- What steps can individuals take to advocate for policy change in this area?</li></ul>
Understanding Alternate Response vs. Co-Response with Atlanta PAD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- What is the difference between alternate response and co-response models in public safety?</li><li>- How has the Atlanta PAD initiative influenced policing alternatives?</li><li>- What challenges exist in shifting from traditional policing to community-based response models?</li></ul>
